**ORDER CONTROLLING ELECTRONIC DEVICES, PHOTOGRAPHING,
RECORDING, BROADCASTING, AND LIVE STREAMING
WITHIN THE JUVENILE COURT FACILITY**

The terms of this Order shall apply to *all persons* within the Juvenile Court facility located at 616 Adams Avenue, Memphis, Tennessee 38103. ***Unless prior approval by the Court has been obtained:***

1. Cellular phones, pagers, tablets, and other electronic devices must be turned off before entering the courtroom; none of those devices may be used in the courtroom. Attorneys may silence their phones and use electronic devices within the bar if necessary to client representation and when their use does not disrupt Court proceedings. Law enforcement officers and court personnel may use electronic devices in the courtroom if necessary to further their duties.

2. Cameras, video and audio recording equipment, radio and television broadcasting equipment, and other similar types of equipment are not allowed in the courtroom.

3. Photographing, video recording, audio recording, broadcasting, and transmitting video or audio by live streaming are not allowed anywhere within the Juvenile Court facility, including waiting areas, stairways, hallways, entrances, and service areas. Law enforcement officers and


court personnel may record or photograph within the Juvenile Court facility in a situation in which they reasonably believe personal or public safety is endangered.

4. This Order does not ban members of the public from attending any matter held in open court that the public is entitled to attend. However, the use of electronic devices or equipment in open court is restricted as described in paras. 1 and 2, *supra*.

5. This Order does not limit legitimate news gathering and reporting agencies or their representatives (“media”) from broadcasting or recording a court proceeding as permitted under Tennessee Supreme Court Rule 30 (Media Guidelines). However, prior Court approval is required. *See* Tenn. Sup. Ct. Rules, Rule 30(A)(2).

6. The Court may punish a person for contempt of court for disobeying this Order and/or obstructing or interfering with the proceedings of the Court by imposing a fine or imprisonment as prescribed for circuit, chancery, or appellate courts. Tenn. Code Ann. § 37-1-158.
